**JOSHUA MARQUIS** was appointed District Attorney by the Governor in 1994, elected later that year and then re-elected in 1998, 2002 and 2006. His current term ends in 2011. Previously, he was the chief deputy district attorney for Deschutes and Lincoln counties and before that a deputy DA for Lincoln and Lane counties. He earned his law degree and bachelor's degree from the University of Oregon.

Marquis serves on the Governor's Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, which helps plan criminal justice police for the State of Oregon. He is a past president of the Oregon District Attorneys Association. He is a vice president of the National District Attorneys Association and a Paul Harris Fellow and member of the Astoria Rotary Club. He and his wife own a home in Astoria.

The District Attorney is elected by the county voters to a four-year term and serves as the prosecuting attorney for the State of Oregon in Clatsop County. The District Attorney is a state employee. The deputies and support staff in the office are county employees.
