


BACKYARD BURNING IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF WILDFIRES



WHAT TO DO TO PREVENT A WILDFIRE

- Check the [DEQ Website](#) for current **Open Burn** restrictions
 - As conditions change, this map will be updated to reflect restrictions in our area



- Understand current **Fire Danger Levels** if a fire were to start in your area
 - **Low** - The color green. Little danger of fire
 - **Moderate** - The color blue. Fires not likely to become serious
 - **High** - The color yellow. Fire may become serious
 - **Extreme** - The color red. All fires are potentially serious



- Call your **local fire agency** and visit their website before you burn or use outdoor equipment to understand local restrictions or requirements
