OCVA at the Travel Oregon Governor's Conference

Last week, the 2024 Oregon Governor's Conference on Tourism wrapped up at the Salem Convention Center. Our entire staff attended this year's conference and engaged in conversations about the future of tourism on the Oregon Coast. Arica Sears (OCVA Deputy Director) presented on accessibility initiatives on the coast, and led a breakout session along with Finn Johnson (North Coast Destination Management Coordinator), on Strategies for Climate Resilience in Destination Management, which delved into how responsible tourism goes beyond singular issues and connects to accessibility, inclusivity, climate and well being.

We're also proud to share that Dave Lacey (South Coast Destination Coordinator), was honored with a Partnership Award for his work with Travel Southern Oregon Coast to promote Whiskey Run as the Oregon Coast's most epic mountain bike system. Finn Johnson, North Coast Destination Management Coordinator, also received an Oregon Rising Star Award for his work on the OCVA carbon emissions calculator and North Coast transit plan for lower carbon emissions. These are incredible accomplishments, and we look forward to our continued collaboration with all the partners working towards a future where tourism enriches Oregon's communities, environment, and visitor experiences.

Snowy plover nesting season has begun

The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department and Siuslaw National Forest remind visitors that it is plover nesting season on the Oregon coast from March 15 to Sept. 15. Visitors can help recovery efforts for the threatened western snowy plover by observing recreation restrictions in designated plover areas. Sensitive plover nesting areas will be roped off or identified by signs with rules and limits, such as staying on the wet sand, to help protect the small shorebirds and their exposed nests during this crucial period. Grant Opportunities

Funds available to improve access to walking, rolling, and public transportation

ODOT will be accepting applications for the second cycle of the Innovative Mobility Program microgrants **starting March 25**. Applicants can apply **for up to \$15,000** to support new and existing projects that improve access to public and active transportation for historically underserved groups. A total of \$350,000 is available in 2024.

The Innovative Mobility Program has a special focus on social equity and helping members of historically excluded groups get where they need to go more quickly, affordably and safely. ODOT wants to improve safety and access for those who walk and roll, while also making it easier to use other transportation modes besides driving alone. Learn more and apply here.

Funds available for transportation projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions

The federal Carbon Reduction Program recently announced its second competitive grant funding opportunity in Oregon. The application window is March 1-May 31, 2024. Examples of eligible projects include public transit, bike infrastructure improvements, low-emission vehicles or fuels, and intelligent transportation systems. Learn more and apply here.

Arts and Culture grants

The Pacific Power Foundation is donating more than \$110,000 in new grant funding to help organizations foster creative expression and enrich local culture in their communities by funding projects including free arts events and education; community celebrations of cultural heritage; multilingual performances for kids; and programs for Indigenous students, rural youth and incarcerated adults. Economic Vitality Grants for Small Business Owners

In partnership with American Express, the Backing Small Businesses grant program supports economically vulnerable and under-resourced small businesses with community reach.
