Who can be a Clatsop County volunteer?

- Students, adults, groups, and families are all welcome to use the general volunteer application to apply for volunteer positions within Clatsop County departments. Volunteers must be at least 16 years old, though other age restrictions may apply based on the nature of the volunteer work.
- High school and college students can earn credit by volunteering with the county. College students in a work study program are also excellent candidates for volunteer positions.
 Volunteers are always needed at the Clatsop County Animal Shelter.
- Families and community groups benefit from volunteering as a team in one of our "adopting" programs, such as Adopt-a-Road or Adopt-a-Park.
- Adults can participate in local government by joining an advisory board or committee. Go
