

Mail Theft

Did you know according to the United States Postal Service, there are as many as 1.7 million reported mail thefts occurring daily? What if there was a way you could actually see the items USPS is delivering to your mailbox each and every day before they actually arrive? It just so happens the United States Postal Service offers a free online service called "USPS Informed Delivery". When you sign up for USPS Informed Delivery, you will receive an email from the USPS each and every morning containing photographs of every piece of mail you should expect to see in your mail box on this given delivery day. Once you have registered with the USPS for this service, you should be able to check your mailbox for all the pieces of mail photographed and listed in the email. If they are not in your mail box, you know it is time to report possibly stolen or missing mail.

Also included within the email will be all tracking numbers pertaining to packages being shipped by USPS and scheduled for delivery at your postal service address.
