## **Purpose**

Inspect residential and commercial buildings and plans for compliance with applicable state and county codes.

### **Essential Functions**

- Inspect the materials of commercial, industrial, public, residential, and related buildings of all complexities for compliance with the state adopted codes:
  - Inspect footings, foundations, framing, mechanical and structural systems and components of concrete, metal, brick and wood buildings; determine compliance with approved plans and applicable codes;
  - o Review construction plans for code compliance;
  - o Inspect for fire and life safety codes compliance;
  - o Inspect building locations for compliance with county zoning regulations and construction specifications;
  - Make final inspection for buildings; complete occupancy permits for commercial, industrial, residential, and public buildings.
  - o Check licenses to insure compliance with State of Oregon laws.
- Maintain inspection records; record code violations, post notices at job sites; file formal reports against builder for non-compliance to notices; prepare departmental reports.
- Confer with builders, contractors, and other permit applicants regarding code requirements, inspection procedures, and violations.
- Consult with supervisor, plans examiners, and other inspectors on code interpretations, inspection problems, and related issues; keep abreast of code changes.
- May testify in court in cases of non-compliance.
- Perform related duties as assigned.
- Follow all safety rules and procedures established for work areas. Comply with all relevant County policies and procedures.

# Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Knowledge of the State of Oregon structural, mechanical, electrical, plumbing and manufactured home codes; knowledge of commercial, industrial, and residential construction materials and methods, and the tools, practices, and methods of the electrical and plumbing trades; knowledge of zoning regulations.



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Ability to interpret codes and apply them to specific installations and sites; ability to detect structural fault and safety violations, and evaluate construction of commercial, industrial, and residential construction; ability to interpret plan specifications and compare them to construction in progress; ability to establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with individuals, whether members of the public or coworkers, from diverse groups and backgrounds; ability to maintain complete and accurate records; ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing.

## **Experience and Training**

Any combination of experience and training that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge ability would be through at least three years of a combination of training and experience in construction, a construction inspection technology degree or a combination thereof.

## License or Certificate

Must possess a driver's license valid in the State of Oregon and have an acceptable driving record. Must have at least the following minimum State of Oregon Certifications: Oregon Inspector Certification (OIC), Residential Building, Residential Mechanical, Residential Plumbing and/or Residential Electrical.

# **Additional Specialty Requirements**

Four years of experience in the inspection or construction of concrete, metal, brick, and wood commercial buildings; or at least two years of technical education and two years of experience as a residential, small commercial inspector; or at least five years combination of experience and education with at least one year of experience in a building design profession, or any equivalent combination of experience and training acceptable to the state Building Codes Division for A level test eligibility.

### Supervisory Responsibility

Supervision is not a normal responsibility of this position.

### Supervision Received

Work under the general supervision of the Building Official who assigns duties and reviews work.
